

**Cindy Bittner 25 Year Celebration...** On Sunday, January 27, we celebrated at the 8:30 am service Cindy Bittner's 25 (actually 26) year tenure as church organist with St. Stephen Lutheran Church. A big THANK YOU to all of you who contributed toward Cindy's gift of a commissioned organ composition. Cindy was very touched and pleased with your outpouring of support. For those of you who may not have been able to attend the service, it was a grand event. We started out the process by contacting Michael Barone, host of "Pipe Dreams" broadcast on MPR Sunday mornings. He provided us with the name of a composer, Rachel Laurin, an organist and composer from Ottawa, Ontario. She provided us with a magnificent celebratory organ piece, entitled *Ommagio Festivo, Opus 89*, which was presented at the organ by Helen Jensen (accomplished organist, friend and colleague of Cindy's). Mr. Barone was able to attend the service (which was prepared by Cindy) and hear, along with all of us, the premier of this beautiful organ piece. The service was followed by a delicious reception with quiche and scones prepared by Kathy Anderson, Carol Hansen, and Anita Schreder. Thank you Cindy for your 25 years with St. Stephen and we hope there will be 25 more. And thank you to all of you who continue to support Cindy, St. Stephen, and all the wonderful and varied music that is a part of this church.

## APPRECIATION

Dear friends of St. Stephen,

Randy and I wish to extend heartfelt thanks and profound gratitude for the overwhelming outpouring of support in the celebration of my 25+ years of being organist at St. Stephen. When I was asked a few months ago by Anne Jackson and Betsy Clark if I would like to prepare a celebratory service in recognition of the milestone anniversary I indicated, "Sure, I can do that." So I picked out the readings, the hymns but I also wanted to feature some of the other very talented musicians I have had the privilege to work with over the many years – Anne Jackson, Phil Dahl and Betsy Clark . That Sunday morning I was most surprised when a very dear organist friend of mine (a petite one person orchestra!!!), Helen Jensen, arrived and then Michael Barone -Mr. "Pipe Dreams" himself ! Randy and I were called up to be presented with the commissioned organ work by Rachel Laurin whom Michael Barone had suggested, and Anne contacted. The work was simply a glorious piece based upon one of my favorite choral works - Ralph Vaughan Williams' Mass in G Minor. Knowing of my King's College connection I love the closing sentence in the composer's notes: 'Though the indications in the score refer to a two-manual organ, this piece will be very well served on a larger instrument in reverberant acoustics'. Helen premiered the piece that very Sunday and it was truly wondrous.

I was most humbled and honored and thank all my special friends at church and Randy for keeping the secret of the special guests - as well as being a very fine page turner! Daddy most certainly would be



very proud and honored by such a magnanimous gift to his daughter and Mommy was very touched when I called her after church that morning just gushing about the day.

As a follow-up to this commissioned work I have been in contact with the composer who was gracious enough to send me another copy to present to Stephen Cleobury, Director of Music of King's College Choir

Cambridge England, also a very fine organist, when the Choir is in town for a concert March 28 at the Cathedral of St. Paul. He, or one of the organ scholars, will play and record the work on the magnificent Harrison & Harrison organ in the Chapel at King's which will then be sent to Rachel before the piece is published prior to the 2020 AGO (American Guild of Organists) convention in Atlanta. What a wonderful legacy for St. Stephen of White Bear Lake, Minnesota when other organists purchase the piece and notes the dedication to its organist of 25 years.....that it recognized and celebrated their 'traditional fuddy duddy organist' (my description of myself!)

I will have the work in my fingers to play this fall before I leave for a 3 month 'sabbatical' from April through June 2020 where, upon my retirement, I will be volunteering at the Chapel and Development office at King's College Cambridge England, but will return for many more years of service to my 'home' church of St. Stephen with so many wonderful friends.

Again, heartfelt thanks to you all for such a kind and generous gift.






