A Stewardship Message About Money

"Where does my money go?" is a question all of us have asked ourselves at one time or another. Sometimes it can be a literal question, and sometimes just a figurative one. If we worry about it and our income is limited, we have to make smart decisions what we do with the money we have and where it goes.

We have three basic choices for our money: we can spend it, save it, or give it away. Our ability to give and save is made possible by our willingness to say "no" to over-spending, which is hard in a society that encourages lifestyles based on taking spendy vacations and driving new cars and wearing trendy clothes. The concept of "self-limitation" can be hard to live with. It is based too much on the premise of what we need, rather than what we want or can afford.

When our income rises and we don't raise our lifestyle to reflect our increased buying power, we accept self-limitation, which then frees up more money for giving and saving.

What lifestyle does the Bible suggest? Is God happy if we gather an abundance of new things? Living comfortably is not a sin. Nor is being rich. God doesn't condemn being rich, but speaks against the self-centered attitude wealth can cause. Living in opulence without regard for others doesn't please the Lord. However, if you love the Lord and serve him and others with your money and time you are free to live in comfort. Your lifestyle should reflect your relationship with Jesus.

The Bible contains countless messages about giving but none are as packed so neatly together as in Mathew 6, 24-34, starting with *you cannot serve two masters: God and money.* A couple of these verses speak to the choice to spend or give, like the 33rd verse where Jesus admits that God knows we must spend to feed and clothe ourselves, but that *he will give them—meaning food and clothes—to you fi you give Him first place in your life and live as he wants you to.*

There it is. God's suggestion about lifestyle, to give first, spend later.

A stewardship prayer: Dear heavenly father, I pray you will enable me to be faithful with all my blessings, especially in the attitude toward and in the management of my money. Help me always to be thankful for what I have. I thank you for your constant love and presence in my life. Through Christ I ask these things. Amen.

(Brief biography of the Reverend Sharon F. Kelly, MDiv. PhD)

Born in Baltimore, Maryland to Betty Ruth Williams Kelly and John Anderson Kelly. Lived with trips to rural South Carolina visiting my mother's extended family. Currently, my mother, siblings, with their spouses and 2 nephews and one niece all live in the city and surrounding communities with extended family related to my deceased father. We attended a Lutheran congregation across from our home now consolidated with another Lutheran congregation.

Earned a bachelor's degree at the University of Baltimore, Maryland. Graduated from the oldest Lutheran seminary in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Now United Lutheran Seminary (consolidated with the Lutheran seminary in Philadelphia). I received settled congregational calls in Kansas City, Missouri and Carlisle, Pennsylvania.



Thomas and I moved to Minnesota in 1999 because Luther Seminary extended a call to me to support students in congregational ministry. While at Luther Seminary I started a doctoral degree in the educational philosophies of work, community, and family at the University of Minnesota. While completing this doctoral degree, I received an invitation from the now retired Bishop Rogness to begin ministry as an interim pastor in Lauderdale, MN where I now reside.

Having completed 8 interim ministry calls in Minnesota, Wisconsin, Maryland, and Pennsylvania and a term as a chaplain in specialty care, I can affirm that God in Christ Jesus has the Spirit on the loose with calling and guiding congregations in transition. As an experienced interim pastor, the witness I have received is that the Christian church within society is blessed with the baptized scattered in many locations supported by the Spirit of Christ Jesus pleading for our leading and serving communally. Prayerfully, I am looking forward to interim pastoral ministry on Sunday, July 2 in accompanying the beloved St Stephen Lutheran congregation during this transition for calling the settled pastor!








Volunteer Helpers for St. Stephen Funerals
