

CHURCH MATTERS

A Stewardship Message About the Joy of Giving

God blesses us for our giving. He doesn't regard our gifts as money. We might, but it's better that we see them as He does, as *investments* of ourselves.

By faith, we understand that the best investment we can make with our ourselves—and our money—is to invest in God's work to build the Christian community around us, no different than our investment to build something vital in our community like a road or a school or a homeless shelter. Basic to all investments is the expectation of a *return*, and in return for gifts to God the giver receives numerous blessings to enjoy. These blessings come in many forms.

Proverbs 11:25 says, "A generous man will prosper; he who refreshes others will himself be refreshed." In Proverbs 19:17 Solomon tells us: "He who is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and [God] will reward him for what he has done."

God has ordained that when we give generously we are to receive generously. As Christians, we should give without expectation of receiving anything in return. However, our gracious God, who loves us so much, thrills to bless us. He has put within us the joy of giving and finding reward in another's pleasure. When we contribute to God's work in our community, we don't celebrate with vanity for ourselves, but with a sense of *Well done, look what we did together*.

Through Malachi, the Lord offered a double blessing to those who gave generously. First, he promised to reward them materially through plentiful harvests. Their crops would produce abundantly and none of their fruit would spoil on the vine. The second part had nothing to do with their crops but pertained to what surrounding nations would see in them, the special blessing that God bestowed on them for their gifts, described in Malachi 3:12. "And all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a land of sparkling happiness."

Sparkling happiness. As a return on an investment goes, it's a good one.

God pours out spiritual blessings on us when we least expect them. When you are giving out of a desire to obey God's command and help others, you will find blessings heaped up and running over. These are blessings not understood by those outside the faith.

COUNCIL CONNECTION

Church Council Updates

Painting the Fellowship Hall – A bid has been made to have the fellowship hall and adjacent hallway areas painted and some repair work done to the walls. Council approved using capital funds to pay for it, with the expectation that some of the cost will be covered through memorial money. We are hoping to have the painting completed prior to Pastor Jim's farewell celebration May 21.

Space Rental – The Evergreen Team has been working on finding ways to close the gap between our income and expenses. They are working with a realtor, Kevin Peck, who specializes in helping churches find suitable tenants to rent some of the excess space in church buildings. Kevin came to the council meeting and made a presentation and answered questions. The council agreed to authorize Kevin to find tenants to rent some of our excess space. He would be paid a small portion of the rent if he finds a suitable tenant. Any prospective renters would be presented to the church council and the council would decide whether or not to agree to having them as tenants. Rental income would increase our revenue with funds from outside the congregation, giving us more resources to support St. Stephen's ministry. The right tenant could enhance our ministry as we host another organization with an aligned mission.

It's Hard to Say Goodbye – As we are in this leave-taking time, preparing for Pastor Jim's retirement, it is bittersweet. He has been our pastor for 30 years. That's a long time! He has been there for us as a congregation faithfully preaching and leading worship on Sunday

mornings and Wednesday evenings for as long as some of us can remember. He's shared his gifts of music and teaching in groups large and small. He's traveled with us on mission trips near and far. He's been there for us as individuals and families at our baptisms, confirmations, weddings, and funerals — so many important milestones of our lives. He has visited us and loved ones in our homes and nursing homes and at our hospital bedsides. He has served with joy!

Soon his ministry will come to an end. Someone else will fill that role. At first there will be an interim pastor who will be with us for a limited time, doing the important work of preparing us for what comes next. And then we'll welcome a new pastor. We pray that God sends us faithful leaders who will serve well. It will be good to get to know the new pastor when that time comes and we're hopeful for what they have to offer. But whoever he or she is, it won't be Pastor Jim.

In recent years the synod has become much more adamant about the expectation that when pastors leave their calls their role with that congregation is done. Pastor Jim will need to sign a document promising not to participate in the life of St. Stephen and not to do any pastoral acts for those who are part of St. Stephen. He's not planning to move, so we may see him around town. Friendships can continue. But he will no longer be our pastor. He won't be officiating for our weddings or funerals. And he will not be attending worship at St. Stephen. We won't hear him whistling, coming down the hall!

There will be time to celebrate his 30 years of ministry as a whole congregation on Sunday, May 21, and he will lead a final worship service on Wednesday, May 31. But between now and then, find time to reach out to him individually and express your personal appreciation for what his ministry has meant to you and what you have appreciated about ways he has touched your life. And pray for him as he enters this new phase of life, that it may be a time filled with many blessings.

Duties of the Bookkeeper:






Faith Ed—Confirmation (5/6)






