A Message from Interim Pastor S. Kelly

Vacation Bible School Ministry Partnership with Redeemer and St. Stephen is always a faith opportunity for learning and service. Young people were crew leaders leading the faith formation of nearly 40 children and tweens. Paul and Melissa were co-captains teaching the daily themes. The Vacation Bible School ministry theme was stellar--meaning Jesus' love shines bright on us all. There were a few folks in the community who returned to this ministry from other Christian congregations. There was the blessing of meeting parents whose children were first-time attendeds. Everyone received an invitation to the St. Stephen Bally Day Worship and Community.



attendees. Everyone received an invitation to the St. Stephen Rally Day Worship and Community Picnic. Our gratitude for the hospitality by the St. Stephen women of the church that keep the children and tweens fueled for learning the Bible and the science of creation that benefits us all.

Continuing Education and Interim Ministry—Called and settled rostered leaders of Word and Sacrament ministry as well as Word and Service have to participate in continuing education. Each month of interim ministry, I will engage in one continuing education day. The second Thursday of each month I attend an interim pastors meeting hosted by the St. Paul Area Synod. We listen and learn about expectations for interim pastors from the ELCA Conference of Bishops. We are called by this synod where the congregation is located. We have a written covenant with each congregation that explains our contract for our ministry skills and needs of the congregation.

The covenant shared with the St. Stephen Council on the areas of ministry that I will focus my time on is worship, adult formation, and stewardship. Of course, I make care-giving calls and following up on inquiries about membership. I will be doing all the tasks that the St. Stephen Constitution requires of any called pastor. I will offer my skills honed to address the challenges of transition that will contribute to fulfilling the mission of God as stated in the St. Stephen mission statement: A Christian community bringing God's love to the world!

The vision statement that we enact is "We are moving forward in faith together; living lives of worship, fellowship, service, and learning."

Adult Faith Formation

The constitution of St. Stephen encourages adult learning or faith formation for everyone post-high school. This ministry practice is to advocate for life-long learning and education within the church and society. This schedule is about Sunday morning events. On Thursdays at 1:00pm God's Word meets. Starting Sept. 13 on Wednesdays at 11:00 a.m. we will study the gospel of Mark. Please share with our office coordinator any book or Scripture-base studies you are hosting. 
Preparing for Rally Day


Save the Date! Gloria's 11th Annual Shortest Marathon (9/16)

Isaiah: Faith and Democracy

Jesus was a storytelling man. His stories were memorable and <u>showed</u> the listeners what they



needed to know about Jesus' instruction and God's love. In the story of the king in Matthew 25, Jesus shows God's priorities: give the hungry food, give the thirsty water, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the sick. visit the prisoner. "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40 NRSV). St. Stephen cooperates with Redeemer and Christ the King, as well as other faith communities, to act on this gospel message. ISAIAH is a combination of faith communities, Christian, Jewish, and Muslim, whose goal, like the goal of St. Stephen, is to bring God's love to the world. This year and for the last decade, ISAIAH has encouraged our state to act on clean energy, restoring the vote for those who have paid their debts to society, creating driver's licenses for all in order to make transportation safer, starting automatic voter registration to encourage all eligible voters to participate in democracy, offering free school breakfast and lunch for K-12 children, using paid family and medical leave to make caring for the sick and needy possible, working on transit for a connected state, stabilizing child care availability, and offering Minnesota Care buy-in to expand access to the state health insurance program for those who are without insurance. Our local ISAIAH group representatives from several churches has met with Lindy Crawford, the White Bear Lake City Manager, Senator Heather Gustafson, Representative Brion Curren, and will soon meet with Tracy Shimek, the White Bear Housing and Economic Development Lake Coordinator. Our goal is to learn about local issues and see how we might be able to help our neighbors. A Unique and Successful Relay for Life 2023 - submitted by Viki Bosin


Friday night, July 28, was unique in so many ways. The team set up all 270 luminaries on both sides of the track by 4:00, and luckily, we covered them all with tarps, because rain poured down with lightning and high winds from 4:30-5:30. When we got the all-clear, we found out our tent and most of our luminaries stayed dry, and we were back on schedule by 6:30!

Unique, and both bitter and sweet. We made new friends with members of Abiding Savior Lutheran in Moundsview, who contributed over \$1100 to our total with donations and luminary purchases, thanks to Pastor Marla Amborn's interimship with them. We renewed and strengthened many old friendships. We cheered survivors. And we mourned our lost loved ones.

Unique, and successful. The entire team met their fund-raising goals. St Stephen contributed over \$6000, plus the additional \$1100 from Abiding Savior, with a total of \$7292. Church member, Nan Duchene successfully launched a new team with her union's retirees: SOAR for the Cure, who raised \$1434. WBL Relay for Life surpassed its goal of over \$140,000, with a total to date of \$143,349. Donations can still come in through September 14, 2023.

I want to thank everyone at St Stephen, but most especially our team: Marla Amborn, Dave Bosin, Robin Eberlein, Anita Schreader, Tom Scott, Cindy Scott, Karen Smith, John Strand, and Scott Zieman. 
