

A Faith Story from Cindy Scott

What is faith? What is a faith story? Faith is trust in something bigger than ourselves. A faith story is an example of that trust based on beliefs or life experiences. We all have faith of different varieties. We sit down in a chair with the faith it will hold us up. That is a simple faith built on past experiences. It's the same with our Christian faith. On our journeys walking with Christ we experience God's grace and blessings in ways that contribute to and strengthen our faith. And because we are not alone on our journey, the faith stories of others in our Christian family walking beside us help us to recognize our own faith. Here is a faith story from Cindy Scott, a member of our Christian family.

My faith story is not exciting in ways that some are, but rather a lifelong story of faith. I was born into a Lutheran family and attended church and all the expected Sunday school and confirmation programs. My faith was totally based on what I had been taught, and I really never had reason to question it. Besides our regular appearance on Sundays, our family never discussed our



faith, never read the Bible (although we were sure to each have our pristine copy beside our beds), never prayed out loud except for reciting our table prayer each meal, but there was really no evidence of our faith in our day to day life.

I stopped going to church when I left home for college. As I grew into adulthood, there were a few significant events that made me reconsider my faith and the role of God in my life. The first was when my high school boyfriend committed suicide. There were some who suggested he would not go to heaven because of his choice to take his own life. This was so inconsistent with my understanding of a loving God that cared for us and prepared rooms for us in Heaven. It made me see for the first time how differently Christians interpret and understand their faith and the teachings of Jesus. It made me start questioning what I believed and how Lutherans understand their faith.

Early in my nursing career, I worked as an oncology nurse in a hospital with a small hospice unit. I saw families that totally relied on their faith for comfort in the difficult times, I saw families who turned away from their faith, feeling that God had betrayed them and wasn't answering their prayers, and I saw families with no faith, struggling with despair and hopelessness. Again, this made me consider what I believed and how I would respond in such a situation.

At age 24, I moved to Minnesota to attend graduate school at the University of MN. As part of that relocation, I chose to join Redeemer Lutheran Church in Fridley. I enrolled in a new member's class which included an 8-week "course" on what it means to be a Lutheran. It was taught by the two pastors who were both very down-to-earth, accessible people, open to questions and discussion of difficult issues. We used the Bible as a reference tool and they knew exactly which scriptures spoke to which issues. This was such a revelation to me! I was a "renewed Lutheran" with a clearer and more certain understanding of how God was with me every day. It created a desire in me to worship regularly and to be amongst others who share my faith.

When Tom and I got married and moved to Vadnais Heights, we tried a variety of local churches, and settled in at St. Stephen in 1994. Marta and Ross Nelson, who we met regularly in the nursery at that time, became our church sponsors. St. Stephen has become a home for us. The people of this church have been the "village" that helped raise our children. They have supported us through some scary health issues, and shared the celebrations of our lives. They have been our Minnesota family when our real families were far away.

I started teaching Sunday school in 1997 when our son Doug was in 1st grade. Teaching our own children and all children about living our faith has been a way for me to grow in my faith. When you're with kids, you have to walk the walk, and demonstrate the concepts you are trying to teach. So it challenges me to live my faith daily, and be a Christian in everything I do. Preparing for my Sunday school lessons was my Bible study and fielding questions from the kids challenged me to explain what I had learned. Sometimes, they stumped me and we needed to ask the pastor, but we all grow this way.

I think it is so important to keep growing in our faith. For me, this sometimes comes from pastors' sermons, sometimes from discussions of books read, and sometimes from lyrics of Christian music. I need to be reminded frequently that God loves me, forgives my sins, and is with me every day. St. Stephen is my frequent reminder!



- Reviewed our current Mission, Vision, and Values and voted to affirm it is still appropriate for guiding our ministry.
- ◆ Discussed plans for the book discussion to be led by Pat Miles, September 24 at 2 PM on her book "Before All is Said and Done: Practical Advice on Living and Dying Well." We encourage congregation members to attend and bring friends.
- ♦ We had a good response to the Cottage Meetings. There will be a summary of findings provided to the congregation following worship on October 1.
- ◆ The next phase in the pastoral transition will include a congregational survey which will be coming out soon.
- Discussed the process and timeline for forming the Call Committee and recommended characteristics of Call Committee members, Referred it to Mission Exploration Team to begin working on identifying Call Committee member recommendations.
- Galilee Lutheran Church has been seeking donations to fund the purchase of property to use to support the local community. St. Stephen had contributed \$500 earlier this year. The Gift Committee recommended giving an additional \$500 from memorial gifts. In addition, Neighbor Helping Neighbor contributed \$1000.
