## Pastor Karri's Message

The earth has started its springtime awakening. As she stretches and yawns from her winter slumber, whispers of green have begun to color the landscape and the excited voices of long sleeping creatures reverberate through the air. After the long dark days of winter, we are ready for the growing hours of daylight and the promise of what is to be. We are in the season of Easter and spring is the perfect time for Easter; a time of birth, of hope, of promise and an assurance of the resurrection.



But not all the world experiences Easter as we do. If you go south of the equator the seasons are reversed, and so while we here in White Bear Lake, Minnesota anticipate the new life and possibility of springtime, others are now experiencing the autumn of their year. They are witnessing the dying off of life and the retreat of animals to their sanctuaries of winter sleep. Easter there is experienced in a whole different context than what we are used to here in the northern hemisphere.

All our familiar Easter images of new life and resurrection don't easily fit in a season that is turning to slumber and dying. In the far south, when trees give up their leaves and their greens turn to brown, the familiar promises of springtime surrender to the realities of endings and death.

Easter in springtime is deeply meaningful, but I've been wondering if the meaning of the Easter promise is most fully realized in the autumnal moments of our lives. Though the image of an autumn Easter may seem foreign to us, isn't it in the season of dying that we experience most completely the true meaning of Easter? Isn't it in the autumn moments of our lives that the immense joy that is felt at an empty tomb is greatest?

Mary and the disciples came to the tomb in the midst of an autumn experience, expecting to find nothing but darkness. But instead they found promise and hope in the light of the resurrection. And like them, God comes into the autumns of our lives with a springtime promise through the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is in an empty tomb that we can find our despair turned to hope, our suffering to peace, our anguish into comfort, our darkness into light, our death into life, our autumns into spring.

May the Easter promise of God's love and light fill you with hope in all the seasons of your life!

He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!



## President's Message—Church Council Update

The church council met on Monday, April 8, and discussed the following:

The Generosity Program is moving forward as planned. Thank you to all our members who have contributed. We are over 75% toward the goal of an additional \$30,000 in special giving.



Also, the council has identified \$22,660 in budget savings that do not adversely affect the success of our ministries. More budget reductions will follow.

At its retreat three weeks ago the council identified two important goals for 2024:

- ◆ to become a more welcoming church and
- ◆ to conduct better community outreach.

At this week's meeting we conducted further conversation on these important matters.

We have created a St. Stephen team to meet with representatives of Redeemer to explore ways the two churches might share ministries, not just to save costs, but to improve the quality of the ministries. There was discussion at the meeting about the status of the ministry sharing initiative.

The council elected not to seek a lease from an outside church to use the Neighbors Helping Neighbors building for its worship services.

### The Generosity Challenge

Thanks to all who have given so generously to the Generosity Challenge to improve our finances. Currently, we have achieved \$25,570 of the \$30,000 goal. We ask that anyone giving to the challenge use one of the special envelopes found on the Welcome Desk in the narthex to help us track our progress at meeting the goal.



### When Someone Approaches You at Church Asking For Cash

Lately, we've been experiencing more people showing up at the church needing assistance. Although we do **not** have the funds to help folks with bills, the pastor does have a "Pastor's Discretionary Fund". We use some money from this fund for gas cards. When someone comes to the church and asks for help, we have a couple requests: 1) they live in the White Bear area. 2) they bring a valid ID. 3) they fill out an Assistance Request form. 4) they must wait six months before returning again for help. Unfortunately, when strangers approach us (staff and church members) and ask for cash specifically, it makes us vulnerable to theft and harassment. If someone you don't know asks you for money, please direct them to speak to a pastor.

## Call Committee Updates

Since our update in the April Steppingstone, a lot of things have happened! We interviewed four candidates recommended by the Synod. Since some of those folks were from out-of-state the interviews were conducted via Zoom.

All candidates were asked the same questions, and the call committee then evaluated them using a rubric, or scoring guide, which we designed specifically for our call process. We agreed that three of the candidates were not good fits for our congregation, however, we extended an invitation for an in-person second interview to candidate #4. Unfortunately, this person decided he did not feel called to St. Stephen and withdrew his name from consideration.

At this point, Rolf Lowenberg DeBoer, our Synod representative, will be sending us one or two additional names the week of April 22. The committee will reconvene on April 25 to begin reviewing resumes (rostered minister profiles) and scheduling interviews.

Although we are beginning the process again with new candidates, we have made a lot of progress since January. We have a good process in place, thoughtful interview questions prepared, and a strong evaluation tool created.

We will find the right person. It may take longer than we had expected, but we do not want to rush the process. Let's all take time to pray about this, ask God to continue to guide our process and connect us with just the right person to serve as St. Stephen's pastor for the next phase of our ministry.

God will guide us as we continue to faithfully do the good work needed to call the next pastor.

## North Lawn Project

We are smoothing and upgrading the north lawn from the manhole cover on the east side, to the building on the south side, to the berm of the raingarden on the west side, to the curb to the north. The renovation area is about 800 square yards. In mid-April, weed killer was used to kill Creeping Charlie patches, 15 yards of screened black dirt was delivered and spread by volunteers (with the help of a rented Bobcat). The yard was then graded and dragged, seeded, and rolled. Finally, sprinklers have been set up on timers. Many thanks to Ken Smith for overseeing this project and to the volunteers who helped along the way. The yard will hopefully be ready for a GAP summer outdoor worship service beginning on Wednesday, June 12th. ***Please stay off the north lawn until June 12th.***


**Guest Pastor...** Thank you to Pastor Ben Coltvet for preaching on Sunday, April 7th!
