



CHURCH MATTERS

President's Message "Radical Hospitality"

Together, we've done a lot in the past year as a congregation. We met and overcame a financial challenge. We successfully navigated a transition process to learn where God is leading us. We've welcomed a new pastor to lead us on our journey into the future. We've worked to become better connected with each another. It's been exciting.

So, what's next? What should we focus on in 2025?



Your church council has identified outreach—i.e., better community involvement and being a more welcoming church—as our best strategy for moving our mission forward in 2025. We can never share *too much* of our Christian message of God's love with the community outside our church. We can be more welcoming. There's an expression that has become popular that I believe we can attach to our step-up in welcoming. *Radical hospitality*. We must adopt as part of our mission to be *radically hospitable*.

What does it mean?

It has roots in a Bible parable found in Luke 15: 4-6, when Jesus told tax collectors and sinners, "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one which is lost, until he finds it? And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost."

Many who read this parable will identify with the shepherd, the person in authority, the one responsible for keeping the sheep together. But the parable assumes a welcoming message if we place ourselves in the 99 and rejoice with the shepherd for finding the one who has been separated or marginalized from us, happy to have our family of 100 restored. As a parable, it means that for those who have returned to us, we are to prepare a place for the *one*, not for assimilation, but for reconciliation.

Radical hospitality goes beyond welcoming. It is to stand beside others after we've welcomed them. Jesus can be viewed as the ultimate expression of radical hospitality. After creating our universe, God showed up in human form—sending Jesus, his son—to have a human experience. God entered our story, rather than demanding that we enter his. So it is with our hospitality. "I want to be part of your story more than I hope you will become part of mine," is what we want to say. We wish to create a feeling of being comfortable, accepted, and valued.

Radical hospitality is to ask "Who isn't here?" "Who have we turned away?" It's more than a strategy, but a mindset that our Christian family is incomplete and we should rejoice the return of those who have been separated.

My challenge to all our members is this: how can *you* practice radical hospitality? What can you do to contribute to the common goal of making St. Stephen a truly welcoming church? And not just for strangers who come through our doors, but to all those who pass by us in need of God's love. As an adjective "radical" means to affect fundamental change of something. Hospitality in a radical way means offering hospitality in a fundamentally different way.

Let's think about it. Let's talk about it. Let's practice it.

Thank you to all who signed up for tickets and attended Lutheran Night at the Twins! St. Stephen Lutheran Church showed up on




the Scoreboard (pictured above) and the Twins beat the Kansas City Royals 8-3!


