### **CHURCH MATTERS**

### **Church Council Highlights**

The church council met on Monday, December 9<sup>th</sup>, and discussed the following:

- The first draft of a 2025 budget was presented by Mary Beth and discussed. The budget includes increases in both revenue and expenses compared to last year, with greater revenue resulting from envelope income and rent we receive from Presbyterian Church In Cameroon and Kingdom Restoration Ministries. Expenses increased due in part to loan repayment for the parking lot repairs. It should be noted that some of the expense reductions of 2024 still apply next year, such as expenses for staff, children/youth ministries, postage, and garbage pickup. The budget is to be finalized in three weeks when our year-end operating fund carryover is known.
- ◆ There was a discussion about the ongoing study to share responsibilities for our GAP worship service with members of Redeemer Church. There is no expected schedule for a shared service. Further evaluation is needed.
- ◆ The council decided to move the annual congregational meeting on January 26<sup>th</sup> to a start time of 10:45 am. With this schedule change, members will not need to leave church after worship and return at 12:30 to attend the meeting, as has been done in the past. It is anticipated that the meeting will last approximately one hour and adjourn by 12noon.





### Blessing a Home at Epiphany

On January 6, the Christian church celebrates the festival of Epiphany, which remembers the visit of the Magi to the newborn Jesus. For many years, Christians have also marked the season of Epiphany as a time for friends and family to gather and offer a blessing for the home.

In addition to spoken blessings and scripture readings, following an eastern European tradition, a visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door; for example, 20 + CMB + 25. The numbers change with each



new year. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing Christe mansionem benedicat, which means "Christ, bless this house," or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

The blessings can be held just at the entrance to the home, or those gathered can process from room to room, blessing the house with incense or by sprinkling water, perhaps using a branch from the Christmas tree.

Pastor Juli and I invite anyone who may wish to have their house blessed in January to sign up at church or to contact the office – we would love to stop by and help you start your year off right!
